The meeting was called to order at 4:00 p.m. in the Missouri room.

The October 13 meeting minutes were accepted as presented.

I. ITEMS – FIRST READING

Item 18 BCH 491 Special Topics. New course.

Item 18.a BIOB 491 Special Topics. New course.

Item 18.b BIOM 491 Special Topics. New course.

- Motion by Mark Jacobson, seconded by Brian Gurney to **approve Items 18 through 18.f on first reading.**

It was noted that with the common course numbering changes, the seminar and workshop numbers were merged into one. These courses had been run under the seminar number, but it was not necessarily appropriate. The 491 special topics course number is the new system-wide number for common course numbering.

Jeff Sanders, Chair, Sociology, Political Science, Native American Studies, and Environmental Studies, stated that these changes delete a course that is no longer taught as the faculty member has retired. In each program, the course is being removed from a list of electives.

Item 14 BS Major in Biology Environmental Sciences Option. Modification of an existing program.

- Motion by Mark Jacobson, seconded by Brian Gurney to **approve Items 14 through 14.b on first reading.**

It was stated that the Department is merging two mineralogy courses into one single four-credit course. These program changes reflect that change.

It was noted that the course change seems to be missing.

The motion and second were withdrawn.

These items will be postponed to the next meeting while the course change paperwork is located.

Item 26 BUS 440 Business and the Environment. Change prerequisite.

It was noted that this is a course which non-business majors are interested in taking, so “consent of instructor” is being added to the prerequisites to allow those students into the course.

Item 27 Minor in Business Geographic Information Systems. Delete program.

It was noted that this minor was created about 15 years ago to work with a budding environmental sciences group on campus. The minor has never really taken off, and there are currently no students in the program. The courses are in Environmental Studies, so they will not be deleted. The question was raised that if there is no cost savings to deleting the program, why delete it? It was noted this is just catalog clean up.

- Motion carried with one abstention.

Item 21 COMT 110 Interpersonal Communication. Change course description.

- Motion by Gary Acton, seconded by Brian Gurney to **approve Item 21 on first reading.**

Sue Balter-Reitz, Chair, Communication and Theatre, stated that this course used to be in the old Communication category of Gen Ed, but is now in the Social Sciences category. The course description is not very accurate, especially as the course is now taught in the new category, so this change updates it.

It was noted that the second page of the form seems to be missing.

Item 23 Minor in Native American Studies. Modification of an existing program.

Item 23.a NASX 406 History of American Indian Women. New course.

- Motion by Brian Gurney, seconded by Vern Gagnon to **approve Items 23 and 23.a on first reading.**

Dr. Sanders stated that the new course is actually a seminar that Reno Charette has taught for several years. The Native American Studies program needs another upper division course, so the course is being formalized. The “NASX” rubric will be the common course numbering rubric for Native American Studies, but NASX 406 will be a unique course in the University System. In the future, they hope to create a Minor in Women’s Studies, and this course would fit right into that program.
