Featured Speaker: Sarah N. Keller, MS, Ph.D., Professor, Dept. of Communication & Theatre, Montana State University Billings, Billings, MT, USA, (406) 896-5824, skeller@msubillings.edu. Dr. Keller's research revolves around health communication, narrative education and service learning. She routinely combines her research with a social marketing curriculum that developed at Emerson College, where she taught in a master's program in Health Communication from 2000-2004. Her curriculum combines professional experiences from overseas entertainment education and health communication campaigns with local non-profits and student learning. Prior to becoming an academic, Keller worked with Population Communication International, USAID, and Family Health International to study media interventions for reproductive health. More recently, Keller has been funded by the Montana Idea Network for Biomedical Research Excellence to evaluate community-based media projects for suicide prevention. Research on her campaigns has

resulted in papers appearing in the Journal of Marketing Education, Nursing & Health Sciences, Journal of Advertising, Health Knowledge, Attitudes and Practices by Nova Press, and others. Her ongoing research agenda centers on examining the use of mass media to promote health behavior and attitude change on a variety of public health topics.

Dr. Reaves's research focuses broadly on language/literacy and sociocultural processes within learning and teaching. Projects that have emerged in this line of study include affective investments as language and literacy learning scaffolds; learning as embodied social and multimodal practice; interest-based, purpose-driven learning and responsive teaching; social creed and cultural intersections within teaching and learning; and supporting critical thinking through image-based reflection and talk. Methodologically her work is situated within qualitative (e.g., ethnography, case study, narrative inquiry, and phenomenology) and post-qualitative approaches in which she seeks to open up the structure of qualitative inquiry while maintaining the use of rigorous research methods. Most recently this methodological quest has led


